IMPROVISING WITH CHORD PROGRESSIONS

I hope that these sheets will provide you with a great resource to begin teaching improvisation with **CHORD PROGRESSIONS** with your students.

- In my book, Theory Tango Level 2, I discuss **TONIC CHORDS** (built on the first **SCALE DEGREE**) as being a home base, which is represented by a house symbol.
- The **DOMINANT CHORD** (built on the fifth **SCALE DEGREE**) is presented as a traveling chord, which usually results in coming back to home base, or **TONIC**.
- If you prefer, you may also name or label the CHORDS with their roman numerals!

The next page will show you an example of how to fill out these sheets with your students.

Directions: Choose the **SCALE** to **IMPROVISE** in. Write it below. Next, identify the **TONIC** and **DOMINANT CHORDS.**

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
